His roles include 2nd Vice President of the San Diego Veterans Coalition, Commander of American Legion Post 275 (2022-2024), Commander of American Legion District 22 (San Diego County) (2024-2025), Advisor at Paws for Purple Hearts, Patriot at The Military Order of the World Wars, Chairperson for the San Diego Veterans Administration's Mental Health Advocacy Council, and former Committee Director at the Federal Council on Criminal Justice's Veterans Justice Commission, chaired by former U.S. Defense Secretary and U.S. Senator Chuck Hagel.

Professionally, Vic serves as the National Director of Community Engagement for Solara Mental Health, a facility dedicated specifically to treating mental health and substance use disorders among active-duty military members and veterans.
